Our reminiscing has taken us from opening day, October 19, 1987, through the development of our digital network, our first docutech purchase, the move to our new plant and our name change to Copresco.


We conclude our 15-year anthology, by welcoming back "Virginia" for a 5th anniversary in *Overnight Lite*.
